9th Grade Summer Reading

Students may choose **one** of these two books to read over summer.

The Boy in the Striped Pajamas by John Boyne.

This coming-of-age novel uses easy-to-understand vocabulary and sentence structure to tell the story of a young man whose father takes command of Auschwitz during World War Two. While the writing style is accessible for struggling readers, the concepts and questions raised foster higher order thinking appropriate for high school studies.

The Five People You Meet in Heaven by Mitch Albom

This novel starts at the end of a man's life and continues with his journey into five versions of heaven where the true purpose of his life is revealed to him by five people. His life-struggles from childhood to death are revealed through a series of flashbacks while his afterlife moves forward. Meanwhile, life goes on for the people with whom he worked. This chronological complexity can be a challenge for some students, but students generally feel a connection to the protagonist that keeps them reading.

Note: movies are available for both of these books, but there are major differences in important parts of the story. Watching the movie **will not** prepare students for the assessment.

Assessment:

I recommend that students take notes about key events while reading. Students will take a multiplechoice **test** about the book of their choice during the first week of school.


